What are the child support guidelines?



- Child support is based on the combined income of both parents.
- Requires information from both parents' incomes
- Each parent is responsible for their prorated share of child related expenses.



How can our guidelines be improved?

- Do the current guidelines adequately support your family's basic needs?
- What should be included in the definition of "basic family needs"?
- What is not a basic family need?

How does child support impact blended families?



- Blended families have children from other partners.
- How has caring for children from a blended family impacted you?
- How can the guidelines be improved to support blended families?

What is shared physical care?



- Increases the basic obligation by 150% to account for increase in costs.
- The threshold is 146 overnights per year (40%)
- Determine each parent's share of the basic child support obligation after multiplying the BCSO by 1.5.
- Multiply using the cross-credit formula
- Subtract the lesser support from the greater.

How should the guidelines address shared physical care?



- When should the guidelines reduce a support obligation for a parent active in their child's life?
- Should the guidelines only consider overnight visits?
- How has the shared physical care calculation impacted your family?

What other factors should be considered in our guidelines?



- How should daycare, school costs, and/or extracurricular expenses impact child support amounts?
- What are normal expenses that all Illinois families experience?
- What is not a "normal" family expenses?

Who should be responsible for health care?



- Should all families share the cost of health insurance?
- How should uncovered medical costs be shared by parents?
- What is the State's role in providing health care?

How should support impact incarcerated parents?



- What should happen to child support when a parent is incarcerated?
- When the parent is released, should support continue at the previously ordered amount?
- Is the current process fair and equitable?

When should child support stop?



- At what age should child support stop?
- In what situations should child support continue past adulthood?
- When should a parent not have to pay child support?
