PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE REIMBURSEMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for professional dispensing fees to participating 340B Hemophilia Treatment Centers (HTCs). The proposed change is effective for dates of service September 3, 2022 and after.

The proposed change provides for an increase in the Medicaid reimbursement rate. Effective September 3, 2022, the professional dispensing fee for Illinois-based HTCs, as defined under Section 501(a)(2) of the Social Security Act, for 340B purchased blood clotting factor will be increased to \$210. This change will increase expenditures by approximately \$10,000 based on current utilization patterns. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
