PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for school-based health services. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on and after July 1, 2021 and is addressed below.

The Department is proposing to modify its reimbursement for school-based health services to a cost settlement reimbursement methodology pursuant to an Individualized Service Plan (IEP), a section 504 accommodation plan, an Individualized Health Care Plan, an Individualized Family Service Plan, or otherwise medically necessary service.

This proposed change will result in an estimated annual increase of \$12 - \$18 million in federal matching funds for local education agencies. There is no cost to the Department.
