PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES CLARIFICATION

This notice provides clarification to the effective date listed in the original public notice issued June 28, 2019. The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after November 1, 2019 and is addressed below.

Effective for dates of service November 1, 2019, and after, the Department's maximum allowable rates for custom orthotics and prosthetics shall be calculated based on the Medicare DMEPOS fee schedule rate in effect on July 1, 2019 minus 6 percent.

The proposed change will increase expenditures by approximately \$3.5 million.

The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
