PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing changes in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse hospital providers. The proposed changes are in accordance with <u>Public Act 102-0886</u> and are effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2023. These changes will be applicable to fee for service payments, as well as included in actuarially sound rates.

The Department is updating the \$3.564 billion hospital assessment program to meet federal guidelines by transitioning payments from pass-through to directed payments and updating fee for service supplemental payments including the state's graduate medical education (GME) program. The proposed changes include reductions to pass-through payments and increases to directed payments, GME, and FFS supplemental payments.

In total, the proposed changes result in an increase of \$62 million to hospital providers.

The proposed changes are subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
