## PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

## STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after October 1, 2018 and is addressed below.

As an ongoing effort to provide access to care and quality services, the Department is proposing to begin coverage for Integrated Health Home Services. Integrated Health Home is a care management service model where all of the professionals involved in a member's care communicate with one another so that the member's medical, behavioral health and social service needs are addressed in a comprehensive manner. The coordination of a member's care is done through a dedicated care manager who oversees and coordinates access to all of the services a member requires.

The reimbursement for Integrated Health Home services will be a per-member, per-month (PMPM) care management fee. There will also be an outcomes-based payment model that rewards measurable, positive outcomes associated with integrated care. These proposed changes will increase expenditures by approximately \$309 million based on current utilization patterns.

The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
