This letter serves as notification to Aetna Better Health (Aetna) of sanction pursuant to Section **7**.16.17 Other Failures of the HealthChoice Illinois (HCI) Contract for Furnishing Health Services by a Managed Care Organization (2018-24-001), between Aetna and the Illinois Department of HealthCare and Family Services (Department), for failure to meet the Quarter 1 (Q1) Calendar Year (CY) 2023 Health, Safety and Welfare (HSW) report categories as follows:
