I. Call to order - Amber Smock, chairperson of the subcommittee, called the meeting to order at 3:01. Gabriela Moroney went over housekeeping items and announced that Jessie Beebe and Andrea Danes have resigned from the subcommittee.

II. Roll call of committee members - Roll call was completed quorum established.

III. Introduction of HFS staff

- **IV.** Review and approval of meeting minutes from March 3, 2022 Kathy Carmody moved to approve the minutes from March 3, 2022. Ann Lundy seconded the motion, which was approved by the subcommittee.
- V. **Public comments** Three members of the public offered comment to the subcommittee: Justine Hochstetler, Tovia Siegel, and Shelly Richardson. Comments conveyed issues and concerns related to home and community based services (HCBS) for individuals with disabilities and immigrants including:
 - Increased demand among African Americans customersand communities on the south side of Chicago.
 - Delayed services for individuals, especially those with mental health and substance abuse, due to taking longer to provide eligibility documents, not understanding programs, or being suspicious of agencies.
 - Managed care organizations not communicating with individuals about referrals to home services program.
 - Concern that Medicaid services for new senior and older adult immigrant groups do not include home and community-based services.
- VI. Overview and timeline for compiling subcommittee recommendations Kimberly Mercer provided an overview of survey that will be issued to subcommittee members and discussed the process and timeline for developing recommendations. Greg Will, Jordyn, Kathy Carmody, and Amie Lulinski offered to assist in the recommendation development process.
- VII. Home and community-based services for Illinois's immigrant eligibility groups Gabriela M. discussed and explained Medicaid programs and benefits offered in the state of Illinois.
- VIII. Money Follows the Person (MFP) update Janene Brickey gave an update on MFP. A letter of intent was submitted, and an application will be submitted before the end of the month. Awards notices will be announced around August 15th.
- **IX.** Medicaid community-based behavioral health service array Kristine Herman presented on Medicaid community-based behavioral health services. Discussion included administrative rules, authorized providers, and the specific services that are available.

X. Additional Business: Old & New

A. Items for future discussion – Chairperson Smock led the committee in a discussion of agenda items for the next two meetings. Consensus was established to address discussion of asset limits in terms of receiving common community based services, reentering the community and accessibility to programs in the July

meeting. It was also agreed that Aging's programs would be a focus of September's meeting.

- XI. Wrap up/action items Several members offered comments and had questions to the subcommittee: Jordyn, Amie Lulinski, Lore Baker, and Angel Miles. Comments conveyed issues and recommendations related to programs available for people with disabilities and accessibility to them.
