## PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

## STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards of payment to providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service April 1, 2019, and after.

<u>Public Act 100-0646</u> requires the Department to reimburse medically complex for developmentally disabled facilities an exceptional care per diem rate instead of the base rate for certain services to residents with complex or extensive medical needs. Exceptional care per diem rates must be paid for the following conditions or services at the specified per diem rates:

- Majority of caloric intake via a feeding tube \$326
- Tracheostomy care without a ventilator \$546
- Tracheostomy care with a ventilator \$735

These proposed changes will increase expenditures by approximately \$30.7 million based on current utilization patterns for the providers enrolled as medically complex for developmentally disabled facilities.
