PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services is proposing a change in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed changes are effective for dates of service on or after June 1, 2024.

The state is submitting a Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) for federal authority to provide for the provision of comprehensive health care services through the Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) effective June 1, 2024. This SPA is being submitted in accordance with Illinois Public Act 102-0043 (SB 2294).

This program provides services to certain elderly participants still living in the community. Participants are provided care coordination and a comprehensive social and medical service package which allows them to remain in the community rather than receiving care in a nursing home. Conditions for participation include:

- dual eligibility (receiving both Medicare and Medicaid);
- age 55 or older;
- living in a zip code served by a PACE organization;
- determined to need nursing facility level of care.

The Department estimates an annual savings of \$2.2 million. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
