



Rural Health Strategy

Why do we need a strategy?

- 16% of the U.S. population is rural while 75% of the total U.S. land area is rural
- 24% of rural residents can reach a Level I or Level II trauma center within an hour
- 60% of all trauma deaths in the U.S. occur in rural areas
- 77% of rural U.S. counties are designated as health professional shortage areas
- Nearly 30% of rural primary care practitioners are at or nearing retirement age, while younger practitioners (those under age 40) account for only 20% of the current workforce
- 11% of physicians practice in rural America despite the fact that nearly one-fifth of the population lives in these areas

Top 10 Rural Health Care Reform Issues

- 1. An economy based on self-employment and small businesses
- 2. Public health insurance plans: dependence and need
- 3. A stressed health care delivery system
- 4. Health care provider and workforce shortage
- 5. An aging rural population
- 6. A sicker, more at-risk population
- 7. Need for preventive care, health and wellness resources
- 8. Lack of mental health services
- Increasing dependence on technology
- 10. Effective emergency medical services


