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Public Comment Notice - Home and Community Based Services Waiver

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) proposes to amend the Home and Community Based Services Waiver (HCBS) for the Support Waiver for Children and Young Adults with Developmental Disabilities – IL 0464. Changes in the amendment include:

- 1. Implements legislation for an increase in the home-based support budget limit.
- 2. Change the sampling approach for Performance Measures I1 and I3 from 100% to Representative Sample with 95% confidence level with a +/- 5% margin of error.
