## PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS or Department) is proposing a change in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2025.

The Department is proposing to update the automatic qualifiers for medically necessary orthodontia treatment. Additional automatic qualifiers include craniofacial anomalies, posterior crossbite with gingival recession involving 3 or more teeth, overjet of 9mm or greater, impacted teeth where eruption is impeded but extraction is not indicated and crowding or spacing greater than 10mm in either arch.

This proposed change will result in an estimated annual increase in Medicaid liability of \$12 million for services provided through fee-for-service or through managed care organizations. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
