PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing changes in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2026.

The Department is proposing to expand the definition of a Critical Access Pharmacy to include independent pharmacies situated within a Medically Underserved Area (MUA), as designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The Department is also proposing to increase the dispensing fee for Critical Access Pharmacies to \$21.05.

These proposed changes will result in an estimated annual increase in Medicaid fee-for-service liability of \$550,000. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
