PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards by which the Department will reimburse providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after April 1, 2024.

The Department is proposing to increase Graduate Medical Education (GME) payments to freestanding children's hospitals by removing the cap on the current GME program for those providers.

This proposed change will result in an annual increase in Medicaid liability of \$10.6 million. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
