PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES CLARIFICATION

This Notice provides clarification to the original Public Notice issued August 25, 2017, to include facilities licensed under the MC/DD Act.

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards of payment to providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service August 1, 2017, and after.

<u>Public Act 100-0023</u> requires the Department of Human Services to include in its rates an increase sufficient to provide a \$0.75 per hour wage increase for non-executive staff working in facilities licensed by the Department of Public Health under the ID/DD Community Care Act as well as facilities licensed under the MC/DD Act. This change will result in a 4.8% rate increase for these facilities.

These proposed changes will increase expenditures by approximately \$15.9 million based on current utilization patterns to the long term care services benefit category.
