## PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

## STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards of payment of the personal needs allowance for residents in certain facility and community based settings. The proposed change is effective for dates of service July 6, 2017, and after.

<u>Public Act 100-0023</u> provided for an increase in the personal needs allowance for a person who is a resident in a facility licensed under the ID/DD Community Care Act, the Community-Integrated Living Arrangements Licensure and Certification Act, the Specialized Mental Health Rehabilitation Act of 2013, or the MC/DD Act for whom payments are made under this Article throughout a month and who is determined to be eligible for medical assistance under this Article.

The personal needs allowance for the individuals listed above will be increased to \$60.00 per month. The proposed change will result in an annual increase in Medicaid liability of \$4.4 million.
