## PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

## STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Department of Healthcare and Family services proposes to submit a Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) which assures coverage of routine patient costs associated with participation in qualifying clinical trials. The proposed change is effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2022.

Pursuant to section 1905(a)(30) and 1905(gg)(1) of the Social Security Act, routine patient costs must be covered for a beneficiary participating in a qualifying clinical trial and include any item or service provided to the individual to prevent, diagnose, monitor, or treat complications resulting from participation in the qualifying clinical trial.

The Department estimates this change will be budget neutral. The proposed change is subject to approval by federal CMS and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
