PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE REIMBURSEMENT RATES

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) is proposing a change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for reimbursement of Early Intervention services by Early Intervention enrolled and/or credentialed providers. The proposed change is effective for dates of service July 1, 2022, and after.

Per Governor Pritzker's June 13, 2022, <u>announcement</u> regarding Investments in Early Childhood, effective July 1, 2022, the Early Intervention Service rates will be increased by 3%.

These proposed changes will increase expenditures by approximately \$6 million based on current utilization patterns for services provided by an Early Intervention provider. The proposed change is subject to approval by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and may be modified or revised during the approval process.
