PROPOSED CHANGES IN METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT RATES

The Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) proposes to modify the Illinois State Plan to recognize a new mandatory benefit effective for dates of service on or after October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2025.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services is requiring state Medicaid programs to provide coverage of Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) services and drugs under a new mandatory benefit. The purpose of the new mandatory MAT benefit is to increase access to evidenced-based treatment for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) for all Medicaid beneficiaries.

Because HFS and the Illinois Department of Human Services/Division of Substance Use Prevention and Recovery (IDHS/SUPR) currently cover drugs and therapy used for medication assisted treatment, the fiscal impact will be minimal.
