I. Welcome and Call to Order

II. Introductions

III. Implementation Update

Dee Ann Ryan and Amy Starin provided an overview of the Workforce Development Workgroup Recommendations including a curriculum of central competencies that will be required for paraprofessionals; certification and credentialing; recruitment of paraprofessionals; and incentives for agencies to hire paraprofessionals who have obtained the certification/credential.

Kristine Herman notified the group that the DRAFT 1915(i) application had been submitted to CMS and that HFS was in negotiations with CMS on the approval, but no firm timeline was yet established. HFS is not anticipating major changes to the programmatic aspects of the 1915(i) but will keep the subcommittee updated as additional information is available.

IV. Feedback and Discussion

Concerns were raised that increasing paraprofessionals would increase the need for masters level supervisors and the cost of implementing the recommendations of the workgroup, specifically on training time and requirements.

HFS requested that the workgroup provide a recommendations section of the report to summarize the key areas for each section.
